This cemetery located in west Randolph Co., Alabama Township 19, Range 10, Section 28, surveyed Feb. 2003 by Linda Ayres, cemetery is a 3/4 acre part of 25 A., located off Ala. Hwy 48 to County road #57 (paved road), to road #228 (dirt road), to road #230 (first part dirt, then paved), about 1/2 mile is a sign on the left side of road (#229 (7), then look on right side of road, part of rock structure visible from road. There is (nailed to a tree) a sign with 'GLADNEY, LYLE, YOUNG FAMILY CEMETERY'.

MARY ELLEN McCANN EASLEY, 87

years old, a long-time resident of Pearland, Texas died March 4, 2016, at Baylor Hospital, Southlake, Texas following a short illness.

She was born September 16, 1928, in Gulfport, MS to Charles D. McCann and Lovelace Stovall McCann. Her father was a local carpenter and her mother was a housewife with five children.

Mary graduated from High School in 1946. She attended college in Decatur, Mississippi, where she married James Kermit Moore in 1948. They moved to Houston, Texas where she raised 3 children. Divorced in December 1961, she

married Frank Davis
Easley in December
1963 and moved from
Houston to Pearland,
Texas. Mary served as
an assistant to Dr.
Charles Klankey at his
clinic in Houston for



15years. She became NASA's astronaut medical assistant and maintained the astronaut medical records for 30 years during the Gemini, Apollo, Spacelab, and Space shuttle era. She received numerous awards during her time at NASA and was well known and respected throughout NASA. Mary retired from government service in 1994.

A descendent of Samuel Gladney, Mary was proud of her Irish heritage. She was a charter member of the Sam Houston Chapter, National Society Daughters of the American Revolution, 1986. She was active in her community and member of the community watch group, working hand-in-hand with the local police department. She was always interested and active in the development of her local community.

Her interests included family, gardening, sewing, reading and travel. She took trips to Europe, Asia, Cuba and the Bahamas and visited cities such as Hong Kong, Amsterdam, Rome, and Paris.

Mary Easley is survived by her children Kay Gibson; Cindy Stellar; and Gary Moore in addition to one grandchild, Michael Gibson.

She was preceded in death by her husband, Frank "Bill" Easley.



- 18. About 23 Unmarked graves, 3 rock covered graves, 1 Unreadable grave, and a cement "G" marker.


It has been said there are members of the Knight family buried here.
