HISTORY:

Opened in 1924, financed by local investors, at the cost of \$1.5 million. It was the largest and grandest in the Carolinas. Named for General Francis Marion "the Swamp Fox", has had a long tradition of gracious service, elegant accommodations and splendid banquet facilities. During the 1920's with the Golden Age of railroads, radio and grand hotels, the Charleston Renaissance was in full bloom and the Francis Marion was the "place to be". Rising 12 stories above the historic district, next to the College of Charleston, across from Historic Marion Square, with 227 guestrooms and suites, it offers views of Charleston's church steeples, antebellum mansions and the harbor. The Hotel has been restored through a \$12 million National Trust for Historic Preservation.

The Hotel and rooms were inspected by Gene and Bettye in March 2005 and they were found to be very nice. The prices offered to us are group rates and reasonable for downtown Charleston.

Smaller Inns had limited rooms and no meeting/eating areas. Most hotels would not "barter" with us. It was the thought of Gladney, Janice, Gene, Wally and I that we are in Charleston to be <u>in Charleston</u>, not out away from the Historic District. Gene and Bettye went to Charleston on Monday right after the Winnsboro reunion. They checked with the Francis Marion Hotel and signed the contract for the July 28-30, 2006 reunion.

country.

"The United Daughters of the Confederacy has awarded Tim the National Defense Medal and it will be bestowed by Mrs. Gene T. Bond (Bettye), a member of the Arkansas Division UDC. The recipient will be presented for the ceremony of Bestowal by medal recipients C. Wallace Gladney, WWII, and Gene Bond, both the Korean War and Vietnam Conflict."

Mrs. Bond states: "I have the honor to present Timothy Ross Johnson, who is to receive the Vietnam Conflict National Defense Medal number 1039, and who is to receive same now." C. Wallace read the certificate and Gene Bond pinned the medal on Tim. "I congratulate you upon this honor which so fittingly typifies your connection with our beloved Armed Forces of the United States of America, our Southern Confederacy and our great organization. All recipients have distinguished themselves by meritorious service to our country in time of armed conflict. Your personal sacrifices are hereby recognized and honored. Your actions reflect great credit upon yourself, and they are in keeping with the highest traditions of the Confederate Military Service and the United Daughters of the Confederacy. WE THANK YOU!"

With no further business or comments, Kenneth Kirkpatrick dismissed the meeting with a prayer.
