In 1923 Alice married Morton J. Fuller. They had one son, Wilmer Carlos Fuller.

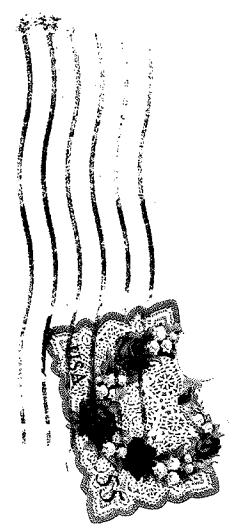
Alice, who retired from Hubbards Pants Factory in 1972 has lived in the same house since 1947.
