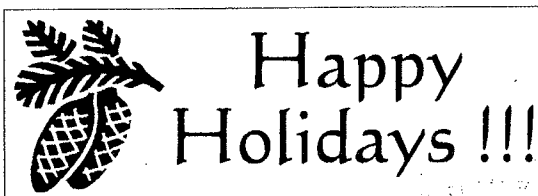

may later order directly from the publisher at any time for any new order you may need.

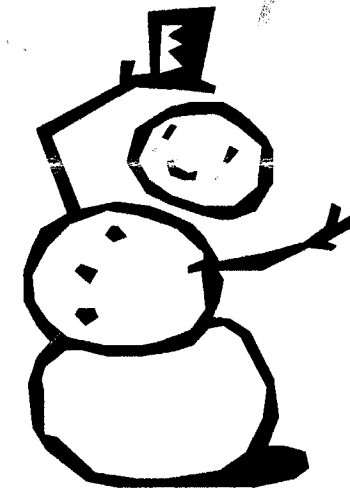
Well, I think I have you up to date. May God Bless and Keep each of you until we meet in Winnsboro in July 2002.

Bettye Bond Receives DAC Award

Bettye Bond was recently awarded the Winnie Davis Medal for her outstanding work for the Daughters of the Confederacy.

In their desire to honor members of the Daughters of the Confederacy and to express appreciation to them for their contributions beyond the required duties of membership, excluding the realm of history, an appropriate medal was designed for this purpose. It is known as the Winnie Davis Medal, named for Varina Anne Davis, who was the youngest child of Jefferson and Varina Howell Davis.

Winnie, so called by her family, is known as "the Daughter of the Confederacy."

The gold oval shaped medal bears the profile of Winnie Davis with her name underneath. It is bordered with laurel leaves,

tied with a ribbon bow with the numerals 61-65.

Mrs. Bettye Bond has been awarded this Winnie Davis Medal for "outstanding contributions beyond the required duties of membership." which includes her creation, development and implementation of communication tools, as well as continued monitoring of said tools, for the Arkansas Division Daughters of the Confederacy. Awarded 28 Sept 2001.

clippings. I dug the grass away and we discussed how best to repair them, he is going to try to fix them and keep them from getting lost. We decided on an estimated \$2,000.00 for the entire cemetery. Some will require very little ground removal, others much more. The very tall ones that are leaning so bad will have to be dug down into the ground and perhaps cement poured around them after they are placed back in the

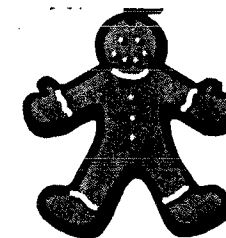


Christmas Recipe

Chocolate Gingerbread Cookies

Very good, and not too hard to make. Makes 3 dozen (18 servings).

- 1/2 cup butter
- 1/2 cup molasses
- 2 (1 ounce) squares unsweetened chocolate
- 2-1/2 cups all-purpose flour
- 2/3 cup white sugar
- 1 teaspoon baking powder



- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 cup milk
- 1/3 cup granulated sugar for decoration

Directions

- Combine butter or margarine, molasses, and unsweetened chocolate in the top of a double boiler. Heat until chocolate melts. Stir until smooth.
- Sift together flour, 2/3 cup sugar, baking powder, baking soda, ginger, and salt. Stir in melted chocolate mixture and milk. Mix well. Chill until firm.
- Roll dough into 1 inch balls. Roll balls in sugar. Place on an ungreased cookie sheet.
- Bake at 375 degrees F (190 degrees C) for about 10 minutes.
